This week has marked the beginning of our 'Money Fortnight' in school. All through the week the children have been putting their entrepreneurial skills to work learning about financial matters and how to make money grow! Each class has been given a starter budget of £10 to invest in their business and to see how much profit it can make. Next week they will be launching their fledgling enterprises and will be selling their products before and after school on Thursday and Friday on the playgrounds. The office will be sending out an e-mail to you all once the children have finalised their timetable. I hope you will be able to come along and support the children.

Many of you have you have been contacted by the office to ask you to sign an Acceptable Use Agreement for your child. Each year the government publishes updates to the statutory guidance 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' which schools must adhere to. This year there is a much greater emphasis on filtering and monitoring measures we must employ to ensure children are kept safe online. If the Acceptable Use Agreement has not been signed, your child will not be able to have access to the internet in school. The office will be very happy to provide you with a copy of the agreement to sign.

Our playgrounds are extremely busy at morning drop off and again when collecting children at the end of the school day. It is very important that for their safety, all children stay with their accompanying adult and do not wander off to the school field or other areas at these times.

Please can we request that parents and carers do not allow their children to use the outdoor play equipment such as the gym equipment or tractor slide. For safety reasons, this equipment can only be used under the direct supervision of school staff. Some of the equipment is currently cordoned off awaiting the replacement of damaged sections and so must not be used.

We would politely remind adults and children that they should dismount from their scooters and cycles at the gates before they enter the school grounds, to avoid the possibility of collisions with pedestrians and ensure the safety of all those who access the site with small children at these busy times.
