### School Uniform Reminder

We pride ourselves on our school uniform as we believe it sets the high level expectation which we ask the children to apply to everything we do in school. As a school we aim to make our school uniform as simple and affordable as possible. The listed items are available from most supermarkets. If you would like to purchase the items with the school logo, these can be ordered online from myclothing.com

Please note that black leggings, short skirts and sweatshirts with advertising logos are not allowed to be worn as part of school uniform. Training shoes and UGG type boots are not acceptable as school shoes.

We will be checking that children are wearing their correct school uniform and kindly request that you inform us if you have any problems obtaining items of school uniform.

FOMP have a good stock of second hand uniform which can be purchased from the School Office at very reasonable prices. Please can we also remind you to name each item of clothing to enable us to reunite lost items of clothing with their owners.

### Applying for a School Place

If your child was born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020, and you live in Cambridgeshire you need to apply for a Reception place for September 2024 before the **closing date of 15th January 2024. Applications received after this date will not be considered until the second round of allocations in May.**
